There was discussion as to the cost of and the concept of eliminating Rhythm & Blues and other popular events such as the Wednesday Concert Series.

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There was a discussion to the importance of providing cultural events (particular free events) during a bad economy and further discussion was had relative to reducing the event from three (3) days as the UCPAC proposes to two (2) days; comparing MusicFest to the Rhythm & Blues' one (1) day event. There was a discussion relative to the benefit MusicFest would provide in the economic stability and success of the UCPAC.

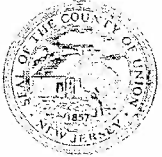


Director Guzzo said he would provide the Bloustein Report to all Freeholders tomorrow (attached).

Director Frank Guzzo spoke of the first round of layoffs (44 layoffs and the elimination of 30 vacancies). Director Guzzo informed the Board that one collective bargaining unit (and likely two (2) additional units) agreed to the concession of a three-day voluntary salary reduction and assured the Board that he would continue speaking with the various collective bargaining units to get them all on board; noting that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He said it is clear the County is looking at another round of layoffs without greater concessions from all collective bargaining units. He noted that they are working on such a plan given the lack of participation of Union concessions.

Director Frank Guzzo updated the Board on meetings with various collective bargaining units. He indicated that many of the Unions are asking what the Board's intentions are relative to the Union County Fair and MusicFest and other County events.

There was a broad discussion relative to the impact of collective bargaining units' lack of concessions and the budget gap.

Acting Administrative Services Director Matthew DiRado informed the next layoff plan will be submitted on March 15th. He informed the Board [REDACTED]

Personnel

The Board discussed the importance that any decision is made with future budgets in mind; noting the importance of a 3-5 year approach. Chairman Mirabella stressed to the Board that the County of Union has done everything to prevent major layoffs in previous years, regardless of how tight those budgets were, but this year is just that much more restrictive.

1. Attorney Client Privilege communication and contract negotiations relative to the County's Health Insurance.

Guests: Tony Taveras, Brown and Brown, Metro

~~Mr. Taveras informed the Board, that in light of an anticipated increase in the County's~~ health benefit costs, Brown and Brown aggressively sought out new Insurance Plans that could realize additional savings to the County; while providing equal to or better than health benefits coverage. Mr Taveras said they reviewed eight (8) plans, including the State Health Plan (as they do every year) and eleven (11) pharmacy vendors.

Mr. Taveras provided the Board with a handout outlining the eight (8) plans. As noted, Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield offered a two-month premium holiday on the \$8 Million in County Term Liability costs. Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield's proposal offered a 2.49% rate over the first 12-month cycle with a premium ceiling cap of 18% the following cycle; representing a cost savings to the County of \$2 Million for the first 12-month cycle. Further conversations were had with Cigna, however they were unwilling to guarantee a ceiling cap of 18% for next year. Mr. Taveas noted that one drawback from Horizon's proposal was the non-inclusion of Summit Medical Group.

Mr. Taveras informed the Board that the State Health Plan was significantly higher. Mr. Taveras informed the Board that Brown and Brown would reach out to Summit Medical to negotiate "out of network" costs; specifically if they would accept Horizon levels (which would be more than what Cigna is currently providing). Another option would be to contract with a second party.

The Board had concerns with employees' anticipated difficulties/obstacles in switching back to Horizon; noting that a continual changing of Insurance Providers is not a conducive way to provide health insurance coverage.

Director DiRado provided the Board with an overview of the initial switch from Horizon to Cigna (in 2009) and addressed what steps the County has taken to ensure a healthier workforce; which ultimately is the best way to drive down insurance costs. He also explained how switching to Horizon would impact the retirees.

The Board agreed to the Horizon Plan.

2. Attorney-Client Privilege relative to contract negotiations with various collective bargaining units.

Director Frank Guzzo informed the Board of Administration's continued attempts to meet with the various collective bargaining units. He reminded the Board that the County's decision to cancel MusicFest and Rhythm and Blues was made public on March 9th. While it is clear the collective bargaining units were receptive to Board's decision, it is unclear whether or not they will accept a three-day voluntary salary reduction. He noted, in large part, the various collective bargaining units are not receptive to such a deal.



The Board decided it was not in favor of Verizon Wireless's interest in the installation of a temporary cell tower on this site.

2. Attorney Client discussion on pending litigation relative to Aspen Landscaping v. County of Union.

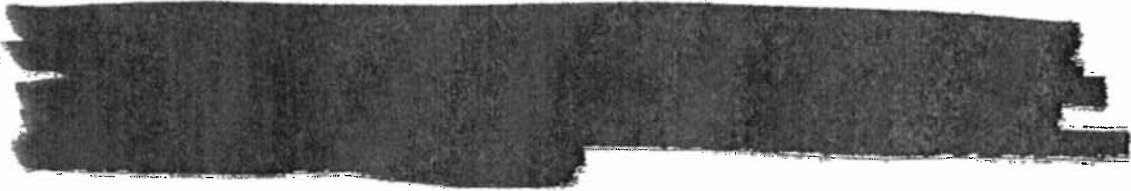

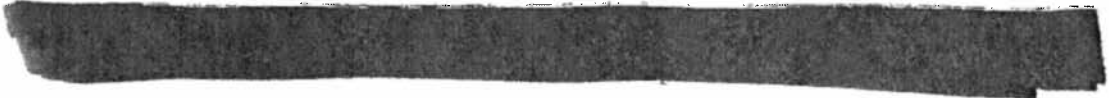
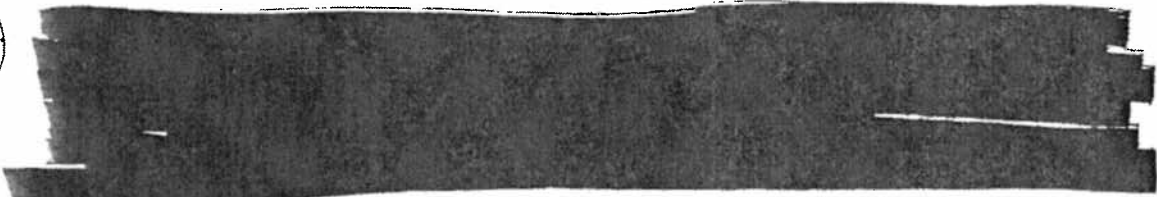

Chairman opened up the discussion reminding the Board of the County's application pending before the Local Finance Board. He noted the state deferred the request until May 9, 2012.

There was discussion as to what exactly they would do with any funds realized through the application to the Local Finance Board; whether or not such a decision would be considered binding if the Local Finance Board approves. The Board was notified that if the money was to go to towards next year's surplus, there would likely be no issue with the Local Finance Board and therefore approved. There would be some concerns of such approval if the

Board were to utilize half of the money towards this year's budget, relative to preserving certain positions and functions, and half toward next year's surplus, but certainly not as much as if the County were to use all funds realized in this year's budget.

A discussion was had relative to the services provided by the various County Departments and the ability to sustain such services. Director Guzzo stated that the various Departments will see a negative impact due to the layoffs, but they will be able to continue to provide critical services.
